The Second Act Farm Tour - January 7, 2022

CWA's 2022 Convention kicked off with the Second Act Farm Tour. Each of the agricultural businesses visited was the second venture for the owners.

First stop was the Peace and Plenty Farm, North America's largest saffron farm. This short blooming, labor intensive growing delicacy was the dream of a former wildlife biologist, Simon, and a community organizer, Melinda. The farm diversified into several other small crops, a farm stand, a studio cottage and Airstream for farm stays, along with Farm to Fork saffron dinners.



Box lunches were prepared by Chef Tammy Lipps who relocated to Lake County with her husband Mark, former CEO of the Manhattan Beach Chamber of Commerce, at their farm and event center, The Ripe Choice. They purchased a heritage farm, utilizing the wide variety of fruit orchards, organic field crops and vineyard to build their food delivery and catering program. The farm also is a Harvest Host, has a studio for farm stays and a cottage kitchen.



We traveled to the Red Hills of Lake County to enjoy the wine, views, ancient olive trees and collection of antique wooden boats of Boatique Winery. The winery, now a multi generational operation, was begun by Bob and Madi Mount. Bob had founded a clinical laboratory and Madi an educator, sold the laboratory and purchased the house, barn and vineyards. There is currently more than 100



acres of grapes, a boat museum and award winning wines.

The tour ended with a drive through downtown Kelseyville where we saw some of the Lake County Quilt Trail. The trail is an agricultural and tourism project that celebrates the community by painting quilt squares on the sides of old barns, and other historic buildings.

AGVENTURE IN STOCKTON By Krista McCoon

Imagine being in third grade never having been on a field trip. But, your teacher tells your class you get to go on your first field trip to AgVenture! The morning of your trip comes, you load your bus and head out, beaming with excitement for the fun ahead.

This scenario is exactly what unfolded on January 19, for over 1,300 third graders from Lincoln and Stockton Unified. Despite challenges from the Covid-19 pandemic, the Stockton AgVenture event was able to occur in-person, at least in part.

Prior to arriving at AgVenture, students viewed presentations virtually at <u>https://www.sjcagventure.com</u>. Students viewed four presentations: health and nutrition, soil/water conservation and two various commodities. Additionally, students took a virtual tour of SJC agriculture and learned about the variety of commodities produced in the county.

The morning of Stockton AgVenture, I had the privilege of greeting the first few buses, something I rarely get to do. I could hear the squeals of delight through the bus doors as students saw animals, equipment and the mobile Sheriff's unit waiting for them.

Just shy of 200 volunteers generously gave their time and energy to educate participants about agriculture and nutrition. Each student had the chance to grab some apples, donated by Fresh Innovations as well another piece of produce donated by Save Mart.

The mobile dairy unit made a special appearance and students learned how to milk a cow and saw a live demonstration. Snowball, the cow, was a huge hit! Dozens of interactive displays hosted by 4-H, FFA, farmers, ranchers and industry members allowed students to taste, touch, see, smell and hear agriculture in a way they may otherwise not. At the conclusion of their trip, students loaded the buses with take home bags of goodies and soil donated by Scott's Co to

plant their cabbage plants donated by Bonnie plants. Volunteers began and ended their day with meals donated by SJ CWA and SJFB.

Despite lesser attendance from both schools and volunteers because of the pandemic, the feedback is clear, Stockton AgVenture was a hit!

A very special thank you to the volunteers, committee members, donors, SJC Ag Commissioner's Office, SJC Fairgrounds and Lincoln and Stockton Unified for making sure students had "An Adventure in Agriculture."
